COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19)

WHAT IS COVID-19?
 COVID-19 is the infectious disease caused by the most recently discovered coronavirus. This new virus and disease were unknown before the outbreak began in Wuhan, China, in December 2019.

- USE FACE MASK
- KEEP DISTANCE FROM OTHERS
- STAY AT HOME WHEN YOU ARE SICK
- AVOID TOUCHING EYES, NOSE OR MOUTH
- STAY INFORMED AND FOLLOW ADVICE

CDCFC COVID-19 Project Safe Return Plan

Outlines safe work strategies to reduce the risk of exposure and transmission of COVID-19 at CDCFC sites and partner centers.

The Plan

- Reduce risk of employee, parents, children and volunteers to Coronavirus
- Identify and implement protective measures
- Cleaning and sanitizing
- Personal Protective Equipment

Prevention

- Handwashing often
- Physical distancing
- Respiratory hygiene (covering sneezes and coughs)
- Using face coverings and gloves
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces

COVID Testing

The City of Columbus, Department of Health has opened a COVID Testing site to ensure all Central Ohio residents have access to testing. Testing is critical to prevent the spread of the virus and should be sought as soon as symptoms develop. Residents are not required to have health benefits nor obtain a physician's referral, but registration and an appointment are strongly encouraged.

Child and Parent Protocol

CDCFC HAS INSTITUTED THE FOLLOWING SAFETY PROTOCOLS

- Positive tests for COVID-19 require 14-day quarantine from the time of exposure; 10 days from the time they experienced symptoms; 3 days passed without fever without medication and improvement in respiratory symptoms; 14-day quarantine required for exposure of family member or having left an impacted area
- Pick-up and drop-off will take place at the door by Center staff and children will be signed in electronically and escorted into the building by Center Designee
- Children and staff will follow ODJFS guidelines for frequent handwashing
- Physical distancing indicators will be placed to provide guidance at drop-off, entrance, and classrooms
- Cleaning and sanitizing will be done on a frequent schedule and include commonly touched areas such as door knobs, tables and chairs, toys, playground equipment and items will be separated between sessions for sanitizing before use in the next session
- Children's meals will now be pre-packaged and children will receive water cups
